


Children with Cancer (Shared Care Patients)

Child Health Patient Information Leaflet



POSCU

The East and North Hertfordshire NHS Trust has a Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Unit (POSCU) at the Lister Hospital. We communicate closely with your primary treatment centre about the care of your child.

The Multidisciplinary Team

The multidisciplinary team (MDT) is made up with many different health professionals. They work as a team to look after the sick child and their parents. The team meets regularly once per month to ensure that information is shared and child progress established.

POSCU Consultant

There is a named Lead Consultant which heads the POSCU MDT and is responsible for the overall care of your child.

POSCU Deputy

The deputy is another senior doctor of the POSCU team who will assist the Lead POSCU Consultant.

Consultant of the Week

Each week there will be a named Consultant Paediatrician who will be responsible for the care of all children on Bluebell ward on a day to day basis.

Pharmacist

There is Lead Paediatric а Pharmacist who advises on all medication for children and in particular the prescribing of chemotherapy and other medicines for children with cancer.

Ward Manager

The Ward Manager is responsible for the day to day running of Bluebell Ward.

Within Bluebell Ward there are eight cubicles, of which two are an en-suite and can be used for the isolation of oncology patients.

When children are in the isolation cubicles they **must not** come out and use the general playroom. Each cubicle has a fold up bed for parents. There are also two locked cabinets for the safe storage of the patient's own medication.

Ward Link Nurse

Oncology Link Nurses are based on the ward. The Link Nurses provide support and updates for the Paediatric Nursing Team. They are also responsible for patient information and deliver feedback to staff after multidisciplinary meetings.

Children's Community Nursing Team

Your child should have a Key Worker who is one of the Children's Community Nursing The Key Worker is Team. trained to support the child and are family who undergoing Further cancer treatment. information can be obtained from your Key Worker.

Play Specialists

There is a team of five Play Specialists. Our Play Specialists will provide your child with specific toys in their own personal boxes. The Play Specialist will assist in distracting your child when investigations need to be carried out e.g. Blood tests, etc.

Ward Housekeepers

The ward has two housekeepers. They will assist in serving your meals and help to choose your menu. Breakfast is provided for parents and other catering facilities are available.

Hospital Admissions and Ward Attendance

- Always bring your Shared Care Oncology Parent Help Record with you
- Always bring your child's entire medication.
- Any oncology child requiring an unplanned admission will be advised to go to Bluebell Ward, the children's ward.
- Cubicles will be provided so that your child can be kept in isolation reducing the risk of cross infection.
- The registrar will be notified that you are here to be assessed and decide if you require admission to the ward.

Please limit visitors to parents and siblings if your child is neutropenic and unwell. If your child requires a blood product transfusion, this can be given during the day, usually without the need for an overnight stay.

The length of stay in hospital is sometimes unpredictable but we will keep you updated daily on your child's progress. Your child will be examined by a consultant during their morning rounds and you can discuss any concerns you may have at this time.

We provide a hard-back general information booklet that informs you about all facilities available for all patients to read on the ward.

If your child is an inpatient for any length of time, please ask a member of staff if you need any help on how to obtain subsidised car park tickets.
