

Patient Information – Care advice after intravitreal injections Department of Ophthalmology

Introduction

The purpose of this leaflet is to explain care advice after having intravitreal Injections. It will also help remind you of instructions which the doctor or nurse may give. Please feel free to ask any further questions you may have.

After the intravitreal injection

- For few days, especially at the injection site, the white of your eye may be slightly red and uncomfortable. This is normal and, if you have any discomfort, you can take painkillers.
- It is common to experience irritability, burning, scratchy sensation, and tearing as the days pass. You can use over-the-counter lubricant eye drops or ointment from your local pharmacy to soothe the eye.
- Apply lubricant eye drops or ointment as needed to ease any pain or discomfort after the injection.
- You should continue using any other eye drops you normally use, unless the doctor instructs you otherwise.
- You may experience blurry vision in the injected eye and experience floaters (black spots/bubbles) for a few days after your injection. This is common and should go away within a few days.
- Avoid rubbing/touching your injected eye for at least a few hours after the injection.
- Do not wear eye make-up for a few days after the injection.
- **Do not** drive for 24 hours after your injection.
- You can have a shower or bath as usual, but for the next 24 hours you should avoid getting soap/shampoo in your eyes.
- You can watch television and read as normal.

Urgent care

If you experience sudden loss of vision, decreased vision or severe pain, visit the Urgent Eye Clinic during opening hours detailed overleaf, or attend your nearest Emergency Department (A&E).

If you need to go to the Urgent Eye Clinic, opening times are:

- Monday to Friday, 9am 7pm (closed Bank Holidays)
- Saturday: 9am 12:30pm
- Closed from Saturday after 12:30pm until Monday at 9am
