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

Manipulation Under Anaesthetic (MUA) of Fractured Nose

MUA is an operation involving the manipulation or straightening of a broken (fractured) nose. The aim of this procedure is to correct the nasal deformity back to its original shape and improve the nasal blockage symptom caused by the fracture.

Indications

Trauma to your nose may cause a shift of the nasal bones. This may cause an obvious deformity of the nose (bent nose) and some degree of nasal blockage.

It is best to reassess the situation about a week after the injury, when most of the swelling has settled. Fractured nasal bones heal about 2-3 weeks following trauma. There is more chance of a successful manipulation (moving) of the fractured nasal bones back to the original position in the second week following the injury.

Procedure and anaesthetic

You will be asleep (under a general anaesthetic) during this procedure. The nose is pushed until the bones slip back into their original position. You may have a splint on your nose afterwards which will remain in place for approximately one week. After the operation you will need time to wake up and will stay in the recovery area. You will be away from the ward for about an hour.

Risks and complications

Occasionally bleeding can occur that may require insertion of packing into each nostril. It would be removed before discharge home. If this happens in the hours following surgery then a further operation may be required to control it. Rarely, bleeding may occur up to ten days after leaving hospital. This could indicate an infection where admission to hospital may be required.

During the operation, there is a very small chance that we may chip or knock out a tooth, especially if it is loose.

Time in hospital

This is a day case procedure.

Post-operative care and advice

The operation will result in a blocked nose and sore throat. The soreness may last up to a week. You will be given pain relief.

Forceful nose blowing should be avoided for at least one week to prevent bleeding.

Care at home and time off work/school

You may need to take one to two days off work/school.

If you have any fresh/profuse bleeding from your nose, return immediately to the Accident and Emergency department or call an ambulance.

Follow-up

A follow-up appointment is not usually necessary unless the surgeon feels you need to be seen in clinic. This will be arranged before you go home.

The swelling/bruising will settle slowly over six weeks after the surgery.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of the surgery after this time, please contact your GP. If your GP feels it appropriate, we will review the situation in the ENT Outpatient Department.

If appropriate, you may then be offered a relatively more significant surgery such as rhinoplasty or septorhinoplasty to improve the appearance and function of your nose.
