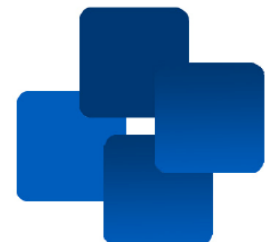

Who is the clinical nurse specialist (CNS) in haematology cancer?

The CNS is a trained nurse specialising in the area of haematological cancers and the associated issues.

Some CNSs are also known as Macmillan nurses and are closely associated with the national organisation Macmillan Cancer Support. This organisation is devoted to helping patients and their families cope with the diagnosis, treatment and effects of cancer.

In East and North Hertfordshire NHS Trust, the role of the CNS also includes support for patients and their family when a cancer is suspected but not confirmed.

Your CNS is also known as your key worker.

How can the haematology CNS help me?

Haematology specialist nurses are experienced nurses and understand the fears and anxieties that patients and their families have when a suspicion of, or a diagnosis of cancer has been made.

They work closely with you from diagnosis and throughout your cancer journey. They are here to support you and your family by:

- answering your questions
- advising and supporting you on emotional, physical, financial, social and spiritual issues
-

- helping you fully explore your treatment choices
- talking through with you any issues concerning your quality of life before and after treatment
- supporting you on finishing your treatment
- liaising and introducing you to other members of the care team who could support and advise you, i.e. dietician, social worker, district nurse etc.

Will the hospital CNS visit me at home?

No. They work very closely with the community Macmillan nurses and/or district nurses who work in your local area. If necessary, with your consent, they will refer you to their care. This means that all your needs will be met by the team closest to your home.

Is my confidentiality protected?

Yes. Confidentiality is protected at all times. They recognise that each patient and their family will have their own personal needs and that these will be different from one person to another.

All your contact with us will be treated with the strictest confidentiality and will only be discussed with another member of the team if you agree.

What if I have a problem out of hours?

If you have a problem out of hours please contact:

- your GP or NHS 111
- out of hours 24 hour (see below)
- local Accident & Emergency department, or
- if you have been a patient at Lister Hospital, contact the ward you were on

What if I feel unwell as a result of my treatment?

If at any time during your course of treatment you become unwell, you must contact one of the numbers below:
